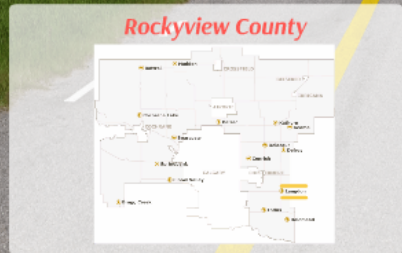

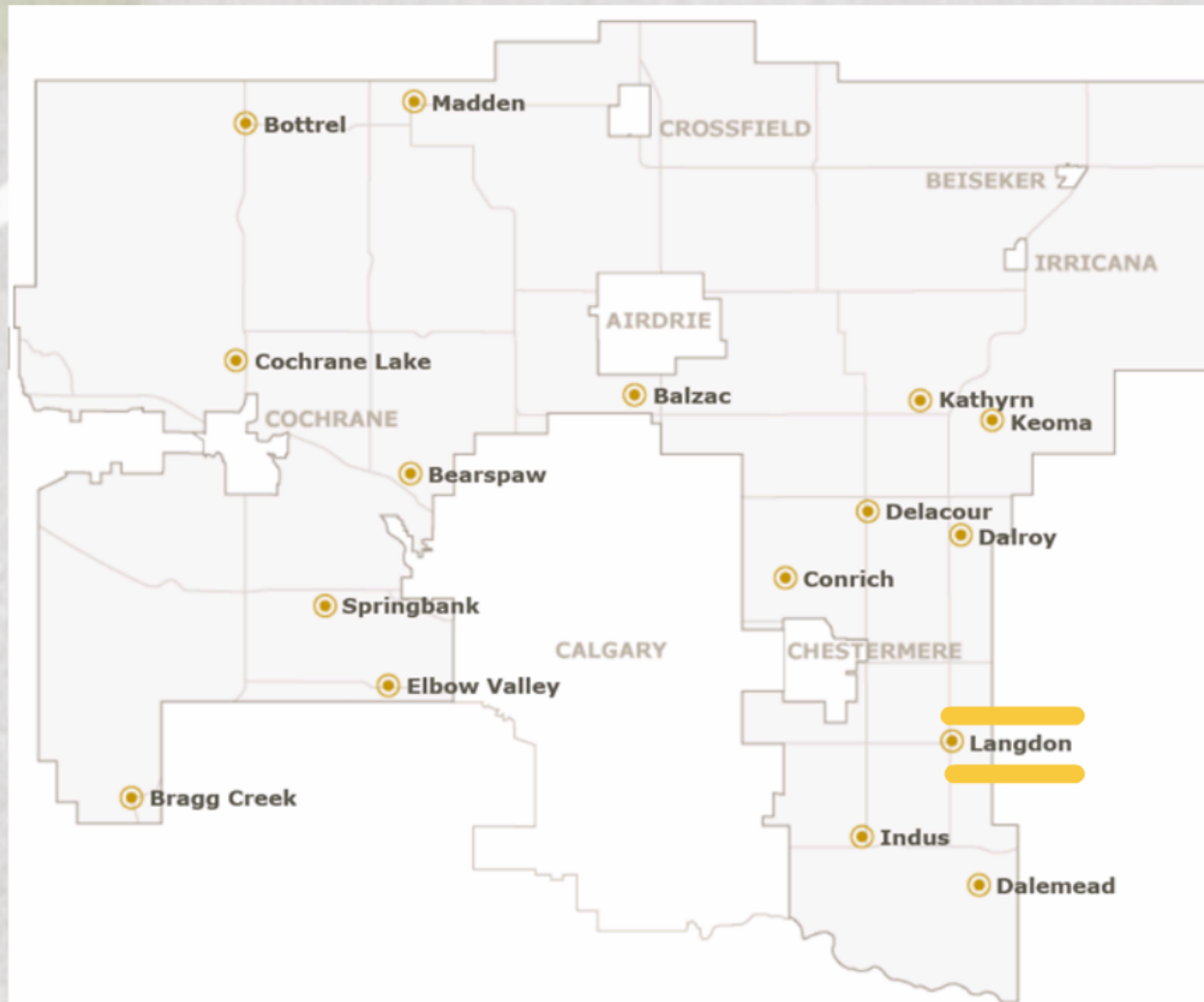

Expect the process to take time with a small team

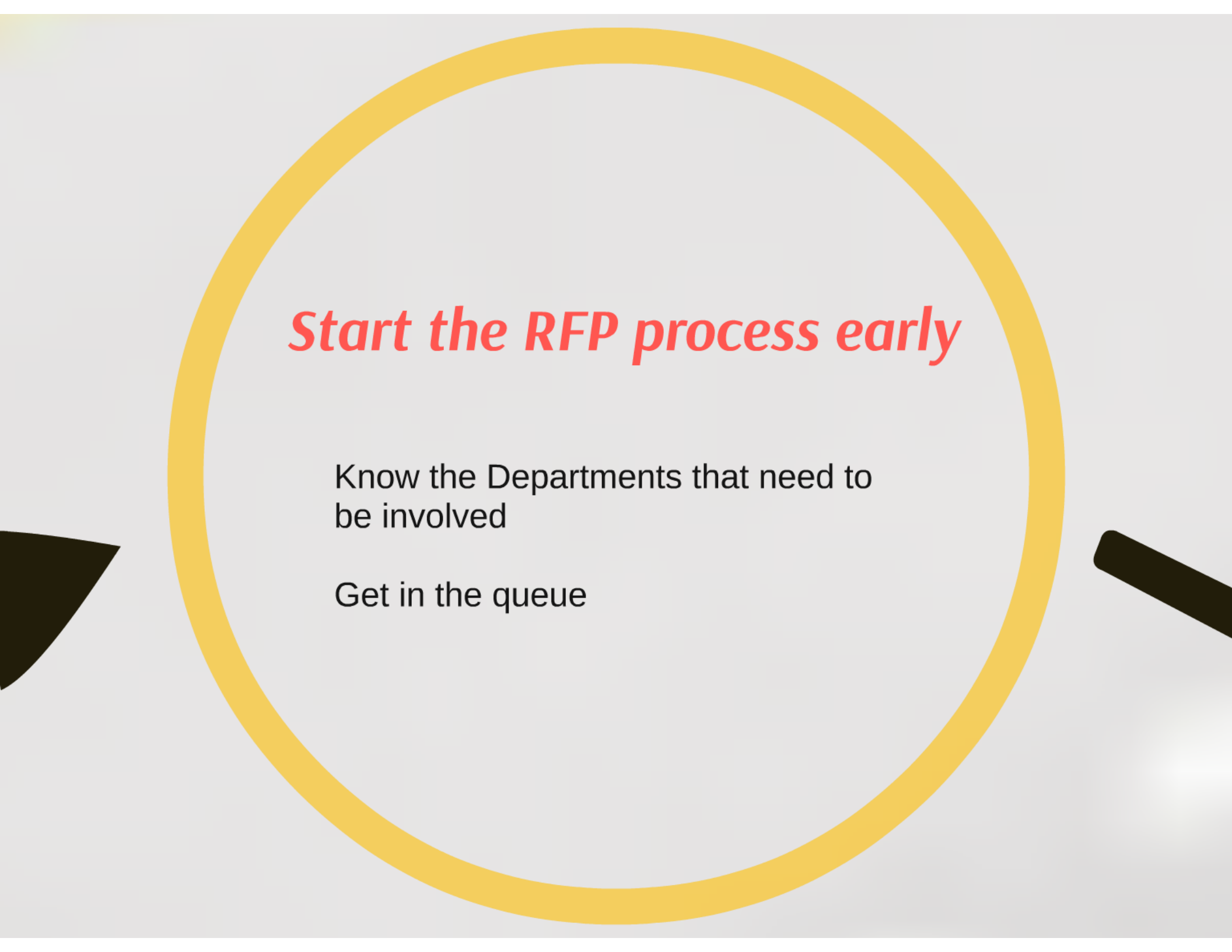
Define who is responsible and accountable

What documents need:

- Department approval or
- Council approval

Documents that need Council approval:

- Agenda
- Document submission

Involvement

Managers should involve the team in the vendor agreement process

- Operations knows the issues and the contract needs to address these

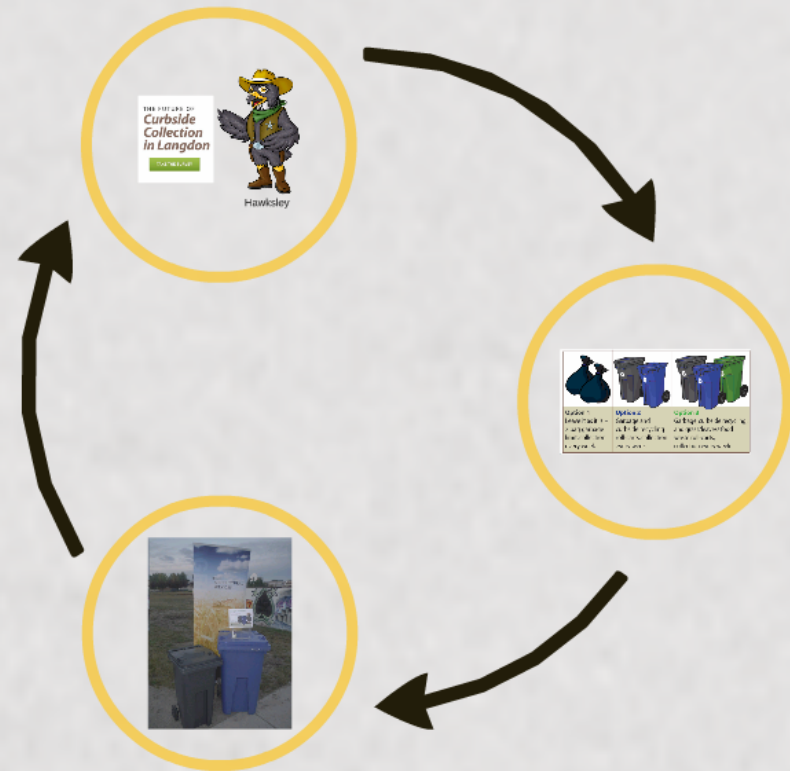

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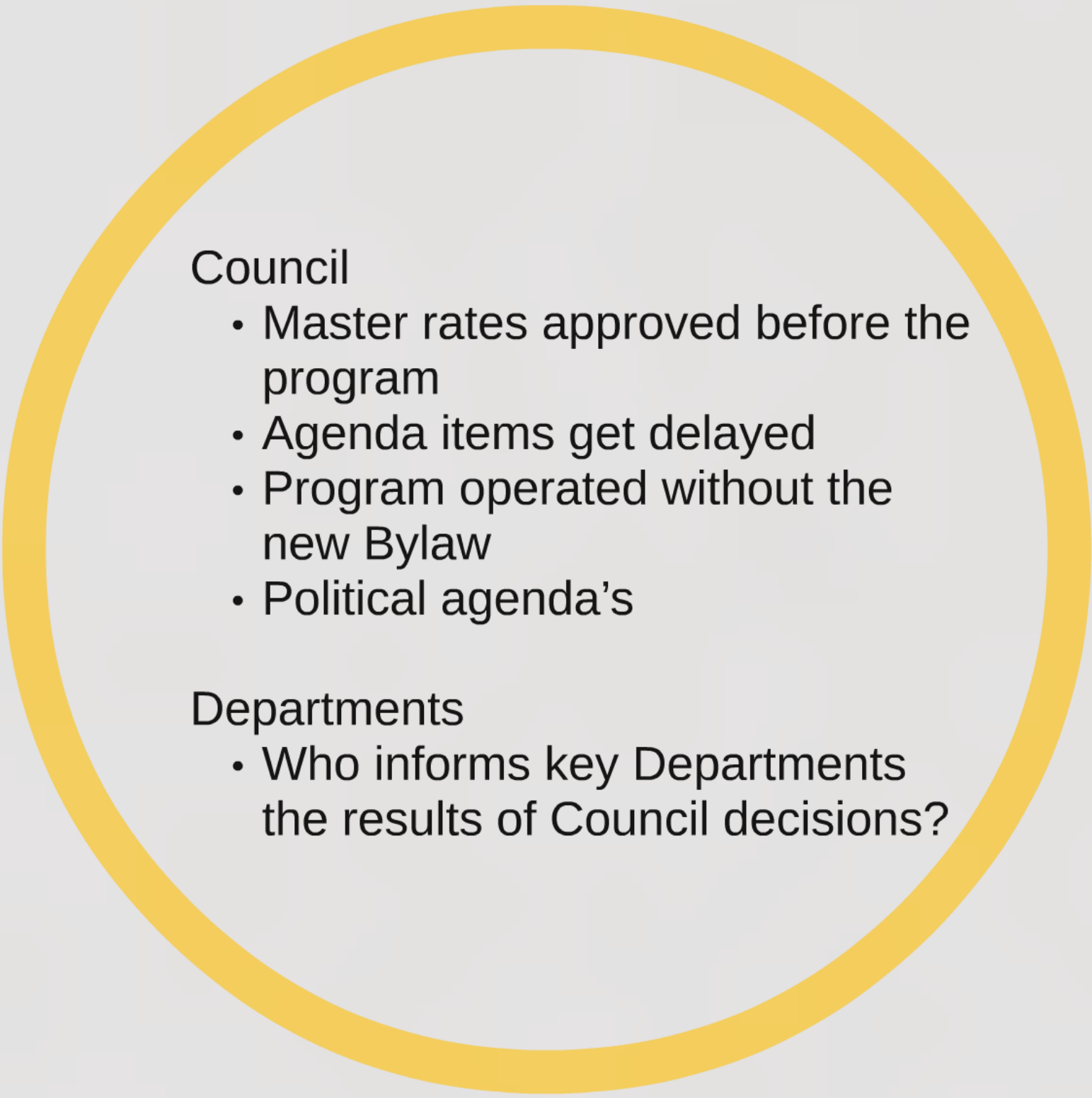

13% : neutral

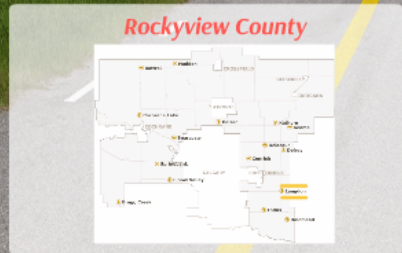
- an indicator that this group is sensitive to the cost of the larger cart option
